## INDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

Lighting. "Indoor housing facilities for dogs must be lighted well enough to permit routine inspection and cleaning of the facility, and observation of the dogs. Animal areas must be provided a regular diurnal lighting cycle of either natural or artificial light. Lighting must be uniformly diffused throughout animal facilities and provide sufficient illumination to aid in maintaining good housekeeping practices, adequate cleaning, adequate inspection of animals, and for the well-being of the animals."

The indoor housing facility has dark areas in the middle and back half of room. It was difficult to see some of the dogs adequately during inspection. The second pair of fluorescent lights were not working at time of inspection. Thirty six dogs are housed in this room. Lighting needs to be improved in dog room to adequately observe the dogs.
